GENERAL DETAILS

ENTRIES: Please submit a complete entry form by midnight, July 15, 2025 for each horse. A complete entry includes current registration papers and current APHA Membership cards, and applicable 2025 Amateur or Youth cards. Check your card status online at www.apha.myshowday.com to avoid a rush fee at the show! Incomplete entries or entries received after July 15, 2025, will be charged at the post-entry fee.

PLEASE NOTE: It is extremely important that all exhibitors and/or owners review their entries and results for accuracy, and any discrepancies be brought to the attention of show staff immediately for review.

MEMBERSHIPS: A current APHA membership is needed to compete in APHA-approved classes. It is recommended to apply for Youth/Amateur/Novice/Walk-Trot cards ahead of time to avoid rush fees.

FEES: All fees are posted in Canadian funds. Entries payable by cash, cheque [payable to APHA Zone 10], or e-transfer [aphazone10@gmail.com] at the show; please do not pay entries prior to show. Please leave a blank check with the show office. Entry fees must be settled with the show secretary within 30 minutes of final class on Sunday.

Any unsettled accounts will be charged a \$100 late fee.

NSF Cheques will be charged a \$50 fee.

PAYING IN US FUNDS: US Cash or US Cheques are accepted! If paying in US funds, please let the show office know ahead of time. A 20% discount will be applied to your show bill and the amount owing to be paid at PAR. US Exhibitors please pay your stall fees and entries at the show with US Cheques or US Cash.

APHA & PAYnt POINTS FEES: As charged by APHA based on class entries. These fees are not included with office, class, or unlimited class fees. PAYnt Points info: www.apha.com/PAYntPoints.

DRUG TESTING: All horses entering the show will be subject to random drug testing. This will include urine and/or blood samples collected by a veterinarian or technician. Refusal of testing constitutes disqualification from the show, forfeiture of all entry fees, prize monies, and awards won.

OFFICE HOURS: Office will open at least one half hour prior to the scheduled show start time and will remain open at least one half hour following the last class of the day. Please check the website and social media for Thursday Office hours.

STALL RESERVATIONS: Stall reservations must be received before July 15, 2025 or post-entry rate will apply. Horses may arrive any time after 12 noon, Wednesday July 30th, 2025. Stalling is in Agricentre-West (Premium Barns).

RV/CAMPING RESERVATIONS: New in 2025 - Please prepay your Camping fees with stall reservations. DO NOT pay at the campground. Reservations must be submitted to APHA Zone 10; spots will be assigned in the North Parking Lot. **REFUNDS:** Entries, stalls, and camping, are non-refundable without a veterinarian or medical certificate.

SCRATCHES OR CLASS ADDS: Please notify the show office of any scratches or adds well in advance of the class. Entries may be allowed at the gate as long as the exhibitor and horse have already been entered in the show at the office.

CROSS ENTRY: APHA cross-entry rules apply in APHA-Approved classes. Per APHA rules, APHA Walk-Trot exhibitors may not enter any Walk-Trot-Canter class, APHA or non-APHA, during the show. Cross entry of Ranch Horses is only permitted into non-APHA Zone-Stakes or Zone-Pots.

COMBINING OR SPLITTING CLASSES: Show Management reserves the right to split or combine classes based on entries. If there are insufficient entries, the classes will be combined by show management. Please refer to the APHA rule book for specific rules on splitting and combining in Youth, Amateur, Open, and Halter classes.

YOUTH 13 & UNDER: Per APHA rules, exhibitors have the option to enter either the 13 & under or 18 and under class but may not enter both on the same horse.

MASTERS AMATEUR: Per APHA rules, exhibitors have the option to enter either the Masters Amateur or Amateur All Ages class but may not enter both on the same horse. If there are insufficient entries (less than six entries in one or both), the classes will be combined by show management.

JUNIOR & SENIOR OPEN: Per APHA rules, Show management may combine or split age groups as justified by entries if there is unanimous consent of all involved exhibitors, If there are insufficient entries (less than three entries in either class), the classes will be combined by show management in order to make the division a one APHA-point earning division.

YEAR END AWARDS: Show qualifies for Alberta, Saskatchewan and BC Paint Horse Club, year end awards programs. Please check your club's year end rules for qualifying.

DOGS: Dogs must be on leash at all times and may not enter the arenas or stands.

LIABILITY WAIVER: All entries are accepted with the understanding that the Zone 10 Paint Horse Committee, the Westerner Exposition Association and the City of Red Deer and each their board of directors, organizers, staff and volunteers shall not be held responsible for any injury or death of person(s) or animal(s) or any damage or loss of property during this event. All horses shall be under the control and management of their owners, exhibitors and related individuals at all times. All owners, exhibitors and spectators enter the showgrounds at their own risk. The individuals shall indemnify and save harmless the above mentioned parties against any and all loss, damages and liability thus occasioned including, but not limited to, any and all legal costs, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of any entry form to the show shall constitute acceptance by each person signing the same of the provisions here-in set forth; and only upon this condition are entries accepted.

ZONE-TURITIES, ZONE-STAKES, ZONE-POTS DETAILS

- \star Open to APHA registered horses.
- \star APHA rules apply for each class unless otherwise noted.
- ★ APHA Ownership rules apply. Amateur or Youth cards must be included with Non-Pro entries.
- \star 80% of all entry fees are added to purse (20% to administration fees)
- ★ Horses will be lined up for individual judge's placings before announcing the overall placings.
- ★ Recognition to top placing horses in all Zone-Turities, Zone-Stakes, and Zone-Pots.
- ★ \$1,000 ADDED DONNA RUTH MEMORIAL NON-PRO TRAIL ZONE-TURITY:

Sponsored by Barb Dimion, BC Paint Horse Club, and Country Life in BC

- Will run concurrently with **Open Trail All Ages Zone-Stake**.
- Horses may only be shown once.
- Non-Pros are encouraged to enter both classes under one go. Scores will be placed in each class.
- ★ YEARLING TRI-CHALLENGE: Entry to the Tri-Challenge includes all three classes. You must show in all three classes to be eligible for payouts.
 - In-Hand Trail and Longe Line scores will be taken from the horse's first class entry. The aggregate score of each horse will place the class.
 - Halter All Genders will run as a stand alone class. Halter will be placed per judge.
- ★ NON-PRO ZONE-POTS | Exhibitor funded. May run concurrently with Open classes.

AWARDS

- ★ SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD Sponsored by Tamara Jameson, Traci Olney, and 3R Woodworking
 - Sportsmanship is the quality of showing fairness, respect, and generosity toward their fellow competitors and for the sport itself when competing. It is an affirmation that an exhibitor is disciplined enough to have perspective, maintain poise and cheer for others. It involves behaviour and attitudes that shows respect for the rules of the show/association and for the exhibitors, officials, staff, volunteers, or spectators they are showing before.
 - Draw boxes will be available to submit nominations throughout the weekend.
 - Presentation will take place on Sunday.
- ★ ROOKIE AWARD Sponsored by Simply Encountered
 - To be eligible, an exhibitor must be a first-time APHA exhibitor in the 2025 year.
 - If there is no eligible recipient, then the award will be given to the returning exhibitor who has not shown in an APHA class in 2023, 2024, or 2025.
 - Points will be collected from all classes.

★ HIGHPOINT YOUTH, AMATEUR, AND OPEN EXHIBITOR Sponsored by Chevron Show Pads

- Awarded to one exhibitor, may show multiple horses in each of the respective divisions.
- All Youth classes (Halter, Color, Walk Trot, Novice, 13 & Under, 18 & Under)
- All Amateur classes (Halter, Color, Yearling, Walk Trot, Novice, Amateur, and Masters)
- All Open classes (Halter, Color, Yearling, Junior, Senior, Green, All Ages)

★ SUPREME HALTER Sponsored by Hydes Show Horses

- Any horse who receives a first under any judge in Open, Amateur, or Youth Halter, as well as Ranch Conformation, will be invited back to show in Supreme Halter in their gender grouping.
- Handler changes are permitted.
- Horses will line up in the arena and re-show to all judges. The Top Three placings under each judge will line up for placings.
- The aggregate score will be awarded Supreme Halter Stallion, Gelding, or Mare.

CLASSES DESCRIPTIONS

All classes will follow the 2025 APHA Rule Book. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to understand the classes before entering the arena.

LEADLINE: Youth Leadline (non-APHA) class entries are free. Leadline competitors must wear a helmet when showing. Open to exhibitors 10 years of age or under. Shown at a walk on the lead line. Exhibitors may not enter any other riding classes at Zone-O-Rama. Horses may be of any breed or ownership. Please enter at the show office by the start of the show on the day Leadline is scheduled to run. Handlers must be at least 16 years old.

ENGLISH VERSATILITY: Horses work individually in this pattern class that combines elements of working hunter mixed with a bit of trail, the spirit of ranch riding, the flow of dressage and the elegance of equitation. The horse will be ridden on light contact without requiring undue restraint. The overall manners and responsiveness of the English Versatility Pattern horse to make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, as well as the quality of the movement and maneuvers are of primary considerations. Judges may opt to use one of the suggested five patterns or create their own, meeting the required and optional maneuver guidelines.

WESTERN VERSATILITY: Each horse will work individually, performing both required and optional maneuvers. The horse should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of an all-around performance horse. The ideal Western Versatility Pattern horse will travel with forward movement and demonstrate an obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. The horse will be ridden on a loose rein without requiring undue restraint. Movement, expression, and attitude are of utmost importance. Judges may opt to use one of the suggested five patterns or create their own, meeting the required and optional maneuver guidelines.

NON-PRO VERSATILITY: A combination between Hunt Seat Equitation, Showmanship, and Horsemanship (on the rail). Exhibitors will enter the arena to first complete their Equitation pattern and then are excused to change to Showmanship. Once all Equitation patterns are completed, exhibitors will follow the same draw order for their Showmanship pattern, then line up on the rail. Once all Showmanship patterns are complete, exhibitors will move to the centre of the arena and one groom per horse will bring in their tack and clothing to change-over to the horsemanship portion (wheelbarrows are allowed). Time limit of 5 minutes to tack and mount the horses. Challenge will be judged 30/30/10/30 for Equitation/Showmanship/Change/Horsemanship.
